Ensuring Proper Acknowledgment of the CCSG P30 Grant in Publications

Why Citation Matters

The Cancer Center Support Grant (CCSG P30) funds the infrastructure and Shared Resources that support cancer research across the CCC. Proper citation of this grant in publications that utilize CCC Shared Resources is essential for:

- Demonstrating the impact of CCSG-funded resources
- Supporting future grant renewals
- Ensuring compliance with NCI guidelines
- Strengthening institutional visibility and accountability



When to Cite the CCSG P30 Grant

You should cite the CCSG P30 grant in any publication that:

- Uses data, services, or tools from CCC Shared Resources (e.g., biostatistics, genomics, drug discovery, etc.)
- Involves collaboration with any CCC Shared Resource

NCIte Citation Guidance

How to Cite the Grant

Include the following acknowledgment in the **Funding** or **Acknowledgments** section of your manuscript:

"This research was supported in part by the National Cancer Institute Cancer Center Support Grant P30 CA016058."

If your publication involves multiple CCC Shared Resources, you may also include:

"We acknowledge the use of [Shared Resource Name(s)] supported by the NCI Cancer Center Support Grant P30 CA016058."

Best Practices

- Use the exact grant number: P30 CA016058
- Include the citation during manuscript submission
- Confirm citation is present before final publication
- Reach out to CCC Administration for help with citation language or questions
